

- ❖ The workshop was conducted on an online platform google meet and all the participants were engrossed in the workshop.




Literacy Methods: Reading Wars!!

- Whole Language Approach
- WL is a method that teaches children to recognize words as a whole piece o language. Belief is that language is a complete system of meaning making with words functioning in relation to each other in a context.
- Phonics
- Phonics is a reading instruction that focuses on teaching children to read & spell words
- It breaks written language down to small and simple componentsphonemes and graphemes.

Points discussed in the workshops are -

- 1. Foundational stages: Concept and its implication for Literacy and Numeracy in NEP (2020)
- 2. The learning crisis in schools. The World is changing fast but our classroom practices remain static.
- 3. Literary methods: Reading Wars! (Whole language approach ad phonics)
- 4. The medium of instruction to be mother tongue and gradually moving towards the second language.


- 5. The need to focus on early childhood education as 90% of the brain development takes place during these crucial years.
- 6. The curriculum must go from bottom to top instead of top to bottom
- 7. Children's leaning needs in EC and what affects these needs? Also taking into account Covid scenario.
- 8. Quality of Pre school education matters and Human Brain Development.
- 9. Balanced Approach
- 10. Language and Literacy go together. Deconstructing "reading"




