Workshop – Implementation of Facilitation Module 4.0

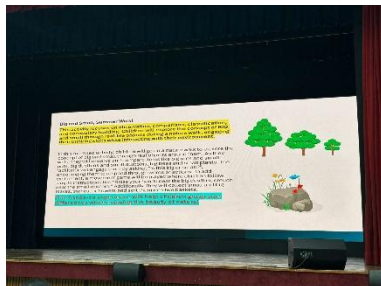

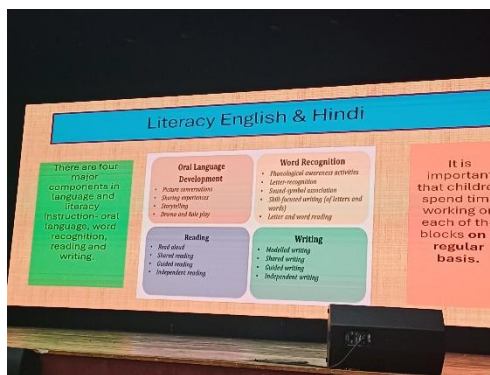
The second day of the workshop on the Implementation of Facilitation Module 4.0 was conducted by Ms. Nanu Rekhi, Advisor, CES. The session was highly engaging and practice-oriented, focusing on effective strategies for implementing FM 4.0 at the Foundational Stage.

The session began with a continued discussion on the concept of story connect, where Ms. Rekhi emphasized the importance of experiential learning through thematic activities. One such example was the “Big and Small – Summer Walk,” designed to enhance children's observational skills, vocabulary, and understanding of size comparison.



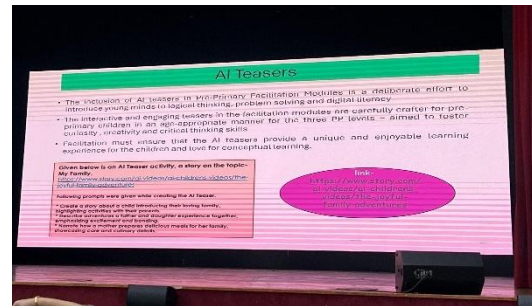
Ms. Rekhi introduced Project-Based Learning (PBL) as a powerful tool to promote inquiry and collaborative learning. She encouraged educators to integrate at least one mini-project per month into their thematic plans to foster deeper engagement and exploration.

A demonstration of the ELPS approach (Experience, Language, Pictures, Symbols) was conducted to support early numeracy development, along with strategies to incorporate mathematical thinking into everyday routines. For language acquisition, she recommended methods such as Total Physical Response (TPR) and story-based learning, especially for unfamiliar languages, to encourage natural and immersive learning experiences. The four block approach was discussed in detail with examples



To develop listening skills, creative activities like “Sound Surprise” were introduced, utilizing family voices and instruments to build auditory memory. The session also highlighted the implementation of the four daily literacy blocks—oral language, word recognition, reading, and writing—with an emphasis on tracking progress through anecdotal records rather than formal assessments. Ms. Rekhi strongly advocated for observational assessments to support a play-based, child-centric approach to learning.

The workshop also included demonstrations of AI-based learning teasers,



with guidance on framing effective prompts to achieve meaningful outcomes across various AI platforms.

The day concluded with a powerful message on the importance of purposeful planning and the role of a thoughtfully designed classroom environment in facilitating learning. A wonderful and inspiring poem recited by Mr. Amitabh Bachan inspired the audience to strive for better. The session reinforced the core values of FM 4.0 and provided a rich and meaningful learning experience for all participants.
